Rules and Procedures specific to Leadership Elections January –March 2021

These rules and procedures have been written to take account of the exceptional circumstances of this election and to ensure that the election is carried out as safely as possible. Where possible, they follow the normal principles of a SUSU election, although the normal full election rules do not apply to this election because of the exceptional circumstances in which it is taking place. They have been approved by the Returning Officer.

Please note that if we are made aware of any candidate who may have breached these rules, we will investigate and refer to the Returning Officer if appropriate, who has the power to impose any sanctions felt appropriate, including disqualification from the election. The Returning Officer may also authorise another person for this purpose.

Each SUSU election has a Returning Officer (RO) and a Deputy Returning Officer (DRO), whose role it is to make decisions during the election and ensure that all proceedings are carried out fairly. For this election, the Returning Officer is Sonya Enright, Head of Academic Appeals and Student Complaints at the University of Southampton, and the Deputy Returning Officer is Avila Chidume, VP Education and Democracy; they have reviewed and approved the content of this document, which now forms the basis for the election.

Nominations:

Nominations are open **from Monday 4th January at 09:00 until Wednesday 10th February at 16:00.** You will need to submit your nomination [here](#).

Please ensure that:

All Candidates

- You are currently an enrolled student at the University of Southampton.
- You understand you will be required to attend the Union's training and induction programme to prepare you for the role.
- You have prepared a statement (sometimes referred to as your manifesto) about why people should vote for you (maximum 500 words) and a short bullet point summary of your main points.
- You have a campaign photo ready to submit. This must be a fairly 'formal' headshot - if you look at the photos of the current Sabbatical Officers on the SUSU website, you will see the kind of photo required.
- You have read and understood the [Job Description](#).
- All manifestos will be approved by the DRO to ensure they do not contain offensive or inappropriate content.

Sabbatical Candidates Only

- If you are an international student, you must check that there are no specific restrictions on your Tier 4 visa. If you have a standard Tier 4 visa, you **can** run as a Sabbatical Officer.
- You understand the requirements of the role - Sabbatical Officers are a full-time, paid position (£21,814 per annum) and the term of office runs from July 1st, 2021 until June 30th, 2022. You must be available for the whole of this time (although you are entitled to annual leave as an employee of the Students' Union).
- You are eligible to act as a Trustee of the Union (this role is automatically a Sabbatical Trustee, and fitness for the role of trustee is defined by the Charity Commission). You must not:
 - have an unspent conviction for one or more of the offences listed here https://assets.publishing.service.gov.uk/government/uploads/system/uploads/attachment_data/file/673797/Auto_disqualification_table_v1.1.pdf
 - have an IVA, debt relief order and/or a bankruptcy order
 - have been removed as a trustee in England, Scotland or Wales (by the Charity Commission or Office of the Scottish Charity Regulator)
 - have been removed from being in the management or control of any body in Scotland (under relevant legislation)
 - have been disqualified by the Charity Commission
 - be a disqualified company director
 - be a designated person for the purposes of antiterrorism legislation
 - be on the sex offenders register
 - have been found in contempt of court for making (or causing to be made) a false statement have been found guilty of disobedience to an order or direction of the Charity Commission)

After Nominations Close:

- All candidates will be invited to an online candidate briefing on Friday 12th February.
- Candidates will be officially announced by SUSU on Monday 15th February; after that official announcement, you are free to start campaigning.
- If you wish us to promote a campaign video, you will need to submit it to us by 09:00 25th February. (You can find guidance about filming videos [here](#))

Campaigning:

- Campaigning opens after the official announcement of candidates and closes on Friday 5th March at 16:00.
- All campaigning must be **online only**.
- You may spend a maximum of £20 of your own money on your campaign - as all campaigning is online, this will usually be spent on Facebook promotion etc. You will need to send us proof of your expenditure at the end of the election and any candidate who does not adhere to the £20 limit may be subject to sanctions decided by the Returning Officer and which can include disqualification from the election.
- You must make Avila Chidume as DRO an admin of any campaign page you set up. This will enable her as DRO to monitor any official expenditure.
- You are able to post in any social media groups - with permission of the group admins - **but SUSU clubs and societies are not allowed to publicly endorse candidates**.
- You must **not** receive any endorsements from external bodies, including the University, this also includes University Staff.
- All campaigning must be fair and positive; you must be respectful and must not be negative about other candidates.

- SUSU will provide promotion of all candidates on our social media and ensure all receive equal promotion.
- During campaigning and voting, candidates are not allowed to offer incentives or pressurise students to vote for them.
- If the Returning Officer makes any decisions or candidates ask any questions which could be of general interest, we will make all candidates aware of the decisions/answers

Voting:

- Voting opens on Wednesday, 3rd March at 09:00 and closes on Friday 5th March at 16:00
- All Sabbatical elections are run on the basis of STV (single transferable vote), which means that voters are able to vote for their first choice candidate, second choice candidate and so on.
- The vote count is automated and electronic; at each round of voting, the candidate with the lowest number of votes is eliminated and their votes are transferred to the remaining candidates (ie X has the lowest number of votes and is eliminated; everyone who voted for X as first choice will have their second choice votes allocated to the relevant remaining candidates). This process is repeated until a candidate has 50% +1 of the overall votes cast and is successfully elected.
- All voting will be online via www.susu.org/vote
- The DRO and RO will be present at the count and the RO will sign off the count as properly conducted.

Complaints:

- Any complaints about candidates must be raised to the Representation Team in the first instance (representation@susu.org) who will investigate as necessary with the DRO and refer to the RO where appropriate for a decision; minor decisions will be made by the DRO and Representation Team. The RO or their nominee is empowered to impose any sanctions deemed necessary, up to and including the power to recommend to Union Senate that a candidate be disqualified.

After Voting:

- The results of the election will be announced after the count on **Friday 5th March**.
- The successful candidate will be contacted by SUSU and (subject to confirmation of eligibility to take up the role) will receive information on training and key contacts going forwards.

Other Information:

- Voting system - The election will be conducted using Single Transferable Voting (voters can express their preferences for their first choice, second choice etc candidates)
- Withdrawing - Candidates may withdraw from the election any time from the close of nominations to an hour before the close of voting. They must inform the Representation Team in writing if they wish to withdraw. Any withdrawal will be binding as soon as it has been accepted.
- Current SUSU Officers - Any current SUSU office-holders **may not campaign in an official capacity for any candidates**. This includes using any official SUSU social media to promote any candidates. (These may be used for the purpose of promoting the election generally).
