Role Profile

About volunteering with SUSU:

The Intra Mural Officer works to represent students who take part in intramural sports teams while studying. This includes working to drive participation in intramural sports across all our sites. You will also work with teams at SUSU and the University to help promote intramural sports at Southampton.

In order to apply for the role, you must have experience of being a member of an intramural team (or similar). When applying for this role you are confirming that you meet the eligibility criteria for the role.

We provide full training at the beginning of the year as well as advice and support as you continue in your role. You will gain a wealth of experience through your voluntary role with SUSU, experience that you can use to improve your future employability while receiving recognition for the work you accomplish.

While volunteering with SUSU as our Intra Mural Officer, your role in this mission is described below.

Main Purpose of Role:

- 1) Chair the Intramural Committee (IMC)
- 2) Represent the interests of SUSU's intramural sports teams
- 3) Promote the benefits of intramural sport and increase participation

Main Responsibilities of the Role

Chair the Intramural Committee

- *Ensure that regular meetings are held and attended by sports reps*
- *Take the lead on any changes to intramural league rules, as well as helping resolve any disputes within the leagues*
- *Be the main point of contact for any pitch cancellations or last minute changes to schedules*

Represent the interests of SUSU's intramural sports teams

- *Work closely with the VP Sports to feedback any issues or concerns that arise within intramural sports leagues*
- *Work with SUSU staff to organise referee/umpire familiarisation courses for the intramural leagues when required*
- *Help co-ordinate any intramural teams that compete in Varsity*

Promote the benefits of intramural sport and increase participation

- *Promote the intramural fayre/bunfight at the start of term*

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- *Keep up communication between captains throughout the year*
- *Devise projects, events, and strategies to drive recruitment and improve participation in intramural leagues throughout the year*
